The Profiling Events are held online via Teams for 2 hours, depending on the number of children and prospective adopters profiled.

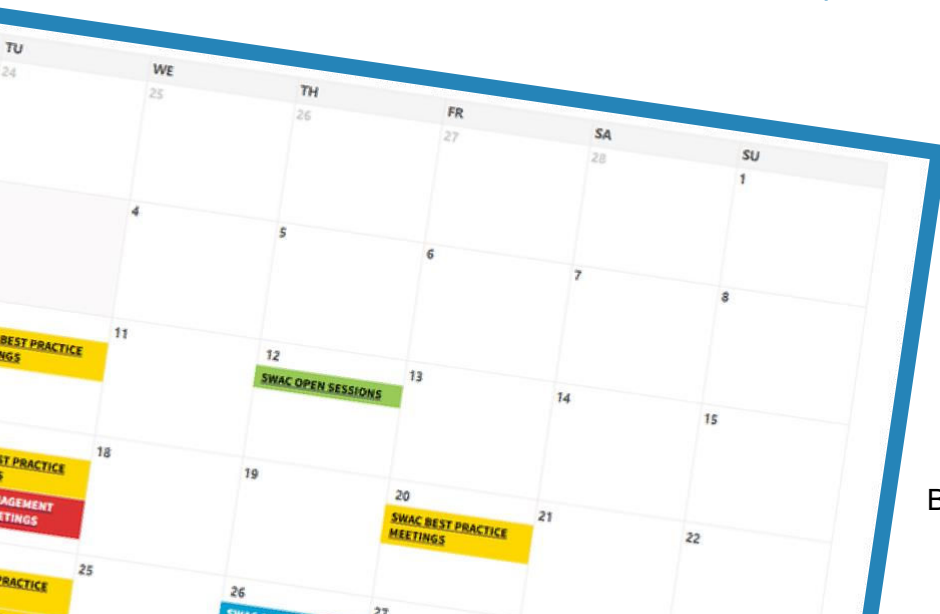

LinkMaker

The SWAC tab on LinkMaker is now up and running so that you and your prospective adopters can more easily identify the children waiting in the 3 SWAC RAAs, and those who are family finding for their children can look for regional matches. Contact Becky if you have any problems accessing it.

Whilst it is always important to cast the net widely to find the best family for any child, there are advantages in placing the child with another SWAC agency if you do not have a suitable family within your own RAA. From the many years of cooperation and collaboration across the region, all the SWAC agencies work in very similar ways, which eases the discussions, the planning and the support around a potential placement. Transitions are also easier over a more contained geographic area, as is ongoing support both immediately after placement and post Adoption Order. The child retains a link with the region they originally came from, too.

We are hoping to encourage those family finding for their prospective adopters and the prospective adopters themselves to make use of the button to look first at the children in our region in need of a family, before looking nationally.
