Over the last year we've worked with hundreds of adoption families, seeing them through their assessments, meeting their children for the first time and providing therapy and support. We remain a strong organisation that is firmly focused on helping children, families and supporting adult adoptees to access birth records.

Finding Families for Children

In the last 5 years CCS has helped 118 families be approved as adopters and placed 158 children with their new adoptive parents.



CCS received enquiries from 223 households, making their first enquiries about adoption.



We held 13 information events, 2 for the LGBTQ+ community and 1 focused on ethnic minority children. 142 households attended these events in total.



CCS held 48 days of training for adopters.



85% of respondents attending Day 1 training rated the session 9/10 or higher, with 91% of that group rated the training 10/10.







Adoption Panel

CCS held 11 panels this year and approved 19 new households. A huge thank you to our panel members who bring a wide range of professional and personal experience to this role and kindly volunteer their time to help approve adopters.

Birth records and Intermediary work



We've completed 11 access to files with adopted adults and written file summaries for these adoptees.



We've received 31 enquires about birth records and intermediary services, signposting people to other agencies or website information where necessary.

183 FAMILIES ATTENDING CENTRE SERVICES



Tots Group

A playgroup for new adopters to bring their children, two mornings a week, to play in a safe and friendly environment.



♦ Prime and A-Team

Regular 6 week activity programmes for adopted Tweens and teenagers. Partnering with local organisations such as Empire Fighting Chance and Horse World.



Wild 'n' Free

Half-day sessions run with Bristol Forest School allow parents to develop healthy attachment with their children in a relaxed and outdoor space.



Parent Support Groups

Meet monthly and aim to develop confidence and resilience, giving parents the chance to get together, share their worries, and develop coping strategies. These groups are for Mums, Dads, Singles and LGBT+ parents.



Create and Connect

Social support and network group with arts and crafts at its heart. Run as a series of short creative activity courses - 4 courses per year.

Therapeutic service key achievements



38 consultations

Completed with 11 families by our psychologists.



Therapeutic Interventions

48 packages of therapeutic support to adoptive families were completed



Therapeutic Training

Hearts and Minds parenting programme, The 8 week training programme ran three times this year and 32 families attended.
